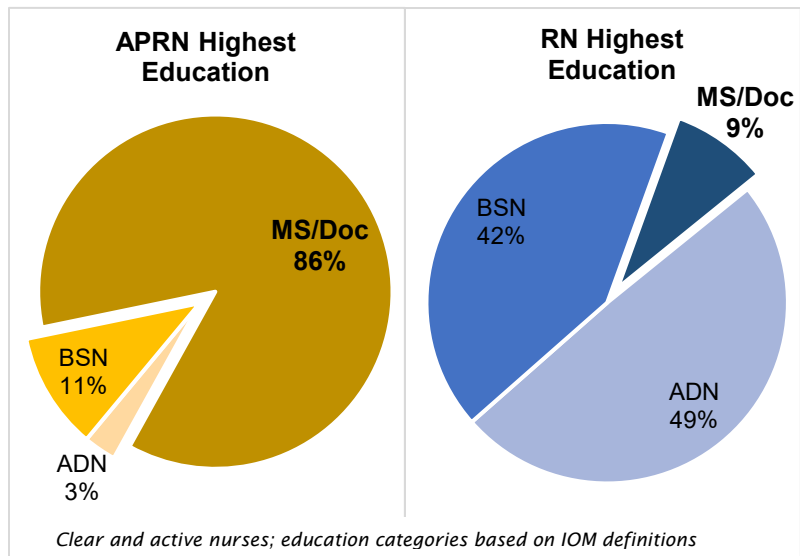
MSN AND DOCTORAL EDUCATED NURSE SUPPLY



Characteristics are based on responses to FCN's survey of nurses during the 2018-2019 renewal cycle. Counts should be interpreted as estimates only.

Florida nurses with a master's or doctorate...

- **9%** of clear and active RNs and **86%** of clear and active APRNs
- **7%** of **working RNs** hold a master's or doctorate *in nursing*
- **84%** of **working APRNs** hold a master's or doctorate *in nursing*, including 75% with an MSN and 9% with a doctorate.



16% of **RNs and APRNs** with a master's or doctorate degree plan to **reduce hours, leave Florida, and/or retire** within 12 months of license renewal, representing almost 4,000 RNs and about 4,100 APRNs.

NURSING FACULTY WITH ADVANCED DEGREES



Pre-licensure education programs had **2,373** full-time (90%) and **2,564** part-time faculty (75%) with a master's degree or higher in AY 2018-19.

55% of LPN, 79% of ADN, and 95% of BSN faculty held a master's degree or higher.

GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS



In Fall 2019, **21 schools** offered one or more MSN curriculum and **14 schools** offered one or more doctoral program.

17 MSN programs offered Nurse Practitioner curricula, 12 had Nurse Educator curricula, 7 offered Leadership/Management curricula, and two (2) offered Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist degrees. One (1) Clinical Nurse Specialist program and one (1) Clinical Nurse Leader program were reported, and 5 reported "other" MSN programs.

Seven (7) schools offered PhD programs, 11 offered DNP – Advanced Practice programs, six (6) offered Executive Leadership DNP programs, and two (2) had other nursing doctoral programs.

Responding programs reported a total of **4,543 students enrolled in MSN curricula** and **2,268 students enrolled in nursing doctoral programs** in September 2019. Additionally, 1,926 graduated from MSN programs and 574 graduated from doctoral programs in AY 2018-19.
