




Florida Nursing Supply













Florida Regional Map






Regional Distribution of Supply of Nurses






Registered Nurses Employment






Projected Growth for RNs in Florida

The majority of Florida's LPNs work in an elderly care setting.




Most of Florida's RNs work in a hospital setting.




The majority of Florida's APRNs work in hospital and physician practice settings.






Nursing Faculty Employment






Projected Growth of Nursing Faculty






Barriers to Faculty Recruitment

2022 FL PRELICENSURE NURSING PROGRAMS - BARRIERS TO FACULTY RECRUITMENT








2021 Florida Post-Secondary Faculty Wages



Florida Statute §464.0195(5)

Evaluation of NCLEX pass rates is a critical step in overall evaluation of the State's nursing workforce as newly licensed nurses are often employed to fill vacant nursing positions.

Graduates who fail the NCLEX cannot enter the workforce as nurses.


2023 FL NCLEX TEST TAKERS BY PROGRAM TYPE




FL NCLEX-RN PASS RATES and NUMBER OF TEST TAKERS 2020-2023





FL NCLEX-PN PASS RATES and NUMBER OF TEST TAKERS 2020-2023






FL NCLEX-RN PASS RATES vs. NATIONAL PASS RATE FROM 2013-2023






FL NCLEX-PN PASS RATES vs. NATIONAL PASS RATE FROM 2013-2023

2023 FL NCLEX Number of Test Takers and Programs by Region






FL 2023 NCLEX-RN Pass Rates by Region






FL 2023 BSN Prepared NCLEX-RN Pass Rates by Region






FL 2023 ADN Prepared NCLEX-RN Pass Rates by Region

Key Findings of 2023 NCLEX Report

- FL produced the greatest number of NCLEX-RN test takers in the nation.
- FL's 2023 NCLEX-RN pass rate was 76.75%, below the national average of 88.56%. FL's 2023 NCLEX-PN pass rate was 74.87%, below the national average of 86.67%.
- FL's NCLEX-RN pass rates ranked 52 of 55 jurisdictions. FL's NCLEX-PN pass rates ranked 52 out of 54 jurisdictions.
- The number of FL's test-takers taking the NCLEX in places other than FL decreased from 14% (n = 3,212) in 2021 to 5.5% (n = 1,171) in 2023.





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
