Education Report Highlights Need to Address Clinical Capacity

FCN's recently-released <u>Education</u> report shows that clinical capacity continues to be a significant barrier in producing enough nurses to meet the state's growing demand. Additional key findings:

- The combined pre-licensure RN graduate rate increase of 2.9 percent is lower than that predicted by forecast simulations to meet demand in 2022.
- Qualified applicants continue to be turned away by all programs in large numbers.
- Both MSN Educator and PhD student enrollment decreased from AY 2008-2009.
- Faculty vacancy rates have increased at all levels of nursing education. Given the increased faculty vacancies, a slight increase in the ratio of number of students to full time faculty member is noted, indicating an increasing faculty workload.
